It gives me immense pride and pleasure to address you all as a first batch student of HSVN, the first sports captain, a former parent and an Executive Committee member. A peak-a-boo into the history of our school. In 1983, due to space constraints at the Hari Sri Nursery, parents of the first batch were informed to take admission for their children in other schools. But a few of the parents believed that their children would get the best education under Nalini Miss, the Legendary Educationist, and wanted their children to continue their education under her able guidance. They, along with Nalini Miss, formed the Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi Trust. They took a rented place near Printwell Press to continue the 5th Standard classes in 1984 and a house near AK Car Care (an automobile workshop) on the Kottapuram Road in 1985 to continue the 6th Standard classes. Initially, with no fund to purchase land to build Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi School, the trust members gave memberships to new members for nominal member fees, searching for a good place to start our school. Finding a suitable plot was a challenge in 1984.

It was my father, C.I Jose, one of the founder members of Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi School and Trust, who identified the current six acres of land which the trust approved, and a token advance was given for the same. It was his idea to sell around three acres of this land and to use the profit from the sale along with the membership fees collected to purchase the current three acres of land where the Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi School cluster block was built.

Being a first batch student, I have seen the school grow, brick by brick. I wish to salute everyone who has taken pains to build this wonderful institution. Under the guidance of Nalini Miss - the living legend, Deepti Chechi, current Executive Director, CEO Unnirajan Sir, Principal Preetha Miss and Executive Committee members, our school not only excels in academics, but also in the cultural and sports fields too.

Dear Children, these are your diamond-studded golden days which you will cherish for a lifetime. We are there with every step you take. Remember, every success of yours is an added feather to the growing colourful wings of Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi School.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

The Model United Nations (MUN) hosted by Nirmalamatha Central School was attended by seven students from Hari Sri, including me. There were two committees - the United Nations Human Rights Committee (UNHRC) and the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), and we were given the freedom to choose the committee and the country that we wanted. I chose UNGA and was assigned as the delegate of Norway.

The conference was held on the 24th and 26th. Being my first MUN, it felt. like a new adventure. On the 24th all the delegates gathered in the conference hall for the opening ceremony.

The committee began with an opening speech. The agenda of UNGA was 'revisiting sustainable development goals' and we had to debate and discuss on it. At lunch break, we got the change to meet with other delegates and form alliances. During the second session, we were given a crisis and all the delegates were engaged in giving ideas to prevent it. Finally, a resolution was made and voting was done to pass the resolution.

On the second day of the conference, we had debates on certain goals of sustainable development. During the debate, the delegate had to state the fact and, at the same time, not lose the decorum. After the working paper was submitted, the committee came to an end. The last hour was a confession session where the delegates wrote their opinion on the committee.

At 5 pm, all the delegates from UNHRC and UNGA gathered in the conference for the closing ceremony.

Being a part of the MUN conference gives one a new experience and the chance to widen one's social circle. MUN is all about meeting new people, discussing matters and having fun.




ലഹരി വിരുദ്ധ പ്രതിജ്ഞ 24th September
