
. No regrets means:

THE FRANK ANTHONY MEMORIAL DEBATE COMPETITION-SENIOR CATEGORY





The children of Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi had an amazing opportunity to attend a Model United Nations at Paramekkavu Vidya Mandir on the 18th and 19th of July, 2025.

MUNs are a platform for students to improve their understanding of global issues and diplomacy. It also increases confidence and public speaking skills, and provides valuable networking opportunities.

The delegation of Hari Sri consisted of 10 students from both High School and Plus Two. The MUN had three committees, namely United Nations Security Council, Global Crisis Response Council and World Health Organisation.

In the UNSC, the agenda focused on 'Mitigating Geopolitical Frictions and Fostering Regional Stability in Central and South Asia.' Our delegates participated in intense debates and consultations, demonstrating their diplomatic skills and awareness of global affairs.

In the WHO committee, the topic was `Mental Health as a Fundamental Right.' Notably, Ishaan Krishna Thamatoor, one of our students, co-authored a draft resolution that was successfully passed.

The GCRC agenda was 'Strengthening Diplomatic Relations and Restoring Geo Political Stability'. It offered a unique simulation set 100 years in the future, where countries addressed hourly crisis updates and tackled evolving challenges in real time.

The delegates from Hari Sri contributed thoughtfully in consultations and played an active role in drafting solutions and resolutions to global crises.

Through speeches and debates some students overcame their fear of public speaking. The committees were engaging with dance, music and other activities

that always lead to a fun and relaxed atmosphere. They had the opportunity to network with peers from other institutions, making the experience not only exciting but also memorable. The MUN was an enriching experience for students helping them understand global issues and improve their critical thinking. All the students received certificates of participation and two of our students - Gayathri V.S. of class 10 and Ishaan Krishna Thamatoor of class 11 even received verbal mentions from the committee for their active participation and outstanding contributions.

MY AFRICAN SAFARI Samuuktha Nair, IV D

Simba, Mufasa, Alex, Marty. I am sure all of you would have thought about the movies 'Lion King' and 'Madagascar.' I had the rare opportunity to see them and more in real life. Mom said we are going to see them. We flew from Kochi to Nairobi, the capital of Kenya. Then, from Nairobi, we drove down to Massai Marra National Reserve Park. On the way there, we passed through "The Great Rift Valley". The Great Rift Valley is a long, deep depression with steep, wall-like cliffs, extending from Jordan in south western Asia southward through Africa - through Kenya till Mozambique.





After a journey of six hours we reached the camp which was situated inside the reserve park. They took us to our room which, to my surprise, was actually a big tent which had a bedroom and bathroom. My mom told me to get ready soon, or we would miss the first sunset in the Savannah. We got into a modified land cruiser for the safari. It was open with a clear view outside. The ride through the Savannah was bumpy. You will not believe what my eyes saw. Hundreds of zebras grazing; it was as if my vision was filled with black and white stripes.

The younger ones had brown stripes. I could not hold my excitement when I saw herds of gazelles, antelopes, topi, and many more varieties of deer. We were accompanied by my mom's friends, who were wildlife photographers. I realized that the photos they captured were a memory made forever. Suddenly, the driver said something to my dad, and he held me tight. The driver drove fast through the bumpy road, and we were bouncing thanks to my dad, who held me in place. The vehicle stopped after 15 mins of bumpy ride. My dad turned my head to the other side of the jeep and told me, "Look there." I could not believe my eyes. I was staring directly at Mufasa, a huge lion.







Also behind him was his family. The pride of lions had small cubs, too. In the meantime the sun came down and the whole place turned golden and this was one of the most beautiful sunsets I saw with lions, lionesses and cubs. I could not have asked for more. Seeing them free, unlike in the zoo where they are caged, it made a huge impact. I truly could understand the earth. We returned to camp and had a good dinner and I slept well.





The next day, we woke up early to go on a hot air balloon ride. When we reached there, I saw a balloon ready. Thinking it was our ride. I went towards it. But my mom said to me our ride was behind me. When I looked behind I saw a flat round cloth on the ground. It was a deflated balloon. A few moments later, they started inflating the balloon with huge fans, and then they used fire. We got inside, and we flew high in the sky, and while floating, we saw a lot of animals grazing. Finally, we landed sideways. We had a lovely breakfast in the forest and went back to camp.



During our safari, we saw a cheetah hunting, but it missed its prey. A cheetah can run fast only for a short time, then it has to rest. Suddenly I heard a meow sound, I asked the guide what that sound was, and he said it was the cheetah. We also saw a leopard feasting on top of a tree. We saw an infant zebra, just born, trying to walk. A giraffe munching on leaves and hippos fighting like the final IPL RCB vs. Punjab Kings.

We saw lots of animals as it was the The Great Wildebeest Migration. The Great Wildebeest Migration is a remarkable wildlife phenomenon involving millions of wildebeest, zebras, and other herbivores migrating across the Serengeti-Mara ecosystem in Tanzania and Kenya. This annual journey is driven by the animals' instinct to follow the rains and find fresh grazing pastures and water sources. We were in the Kenyan Marra side.

I said good bye for now after four days of an awesome safari with a promise to come back again on another exciting adventure.
