



His love for Thrissur, and Kerala, is evident in his poems like 'Thrissur Pooram', 'Kottapuram' and 'Kochi Metro'. "My life is full of wit," he says in 'Kottapuram'. This wit comes out further in poems like 'Heaven and Hell', 'It', 'Jungle' and 'Corona'. His serious side comes out in 'Cadaver' where he concludes, "The dead cannot tell the living that life is often unforgiving". Anaswara, a Class VIII student of Hari Sri Vidya Nidhi exhibits a talent for line drawings and her illustrations add value to her father's poems as she sketches the Corona virus, a jungle with animals, the Mahatma, celebrities like Princess Diana, Mother Teresa, the Ancient Surgeon, Susrutha and the tragic end of Jatayu. Her drawings of the Kottapuram and Vadakkumnathan temples are life-like.
